THE FOLLOWING MOTION WAS PROPOSED and PASSED AT A MEEETING OF SRSG ON 12 MARCH 2016 (23 MEMBERS ATTENDING AND VOTING)

Proposed John Launder, Seconded James Patten, Unanimously agreed.

"We hereby establish SKIPTON REFUGEE SUPPORT GROUP AS A CHARITABLE VOLUNTARY ORGANISATION

1. OBJECTS of SRSG:

1.1 To promote and provide personal, financial, material and other support to refugees residing in Skipton and surrounding areas

1.2 To promote and provide personal, financial, material and other support to refugees in the UK and the World

1.3 To promote awareness of refugee issues through events, education and campaigns

2. POWERS OF SRSG

2.1 To carry out the business of SRSG to achieve the above Objects

2.2 To receive and distribute monies and material property

- 2.3 To operate a bank account and appoint bank signatories
- 2.4 To establish a Committee to manage CRSG

3. TERMS

The term "refugee" shall include:

3.1 persons having "Refugee Status"

3.2 persons claiming asylum

3.3 persons who may be deemed 'migrants' and are seeking a place of sanctuary for the purposes of claiming asylum

4. MEETINGS AND COMMUNICATIONS

4.1 SRSG shall held Annual General Meetings at appropriate times

4.2 The Committee may, and on the request of five or more Members shall, call a General Meeting

4.3 The Committee shall meet at least once every two months

4.4 Decisions of the Committee may be taken through electronic communication

4.5 Electronic communication may be used for business notices to members

4.6 A simple majority shall apply to decisions of the committee and members.

Except that a two thirds majority of members shall apply for changes to this Constitution and to Dissolution of CRSG

4.7 If the members decide to dissolve SRSG the assets shall be transferred to a charity or voluntary organisation having similar Objects to SRSG

5. ALL OTHERS MATTERS

Reference shall be made to the "Model Constitutions" issued by the Charity Commission

1. Signatures for bank account

Decided signatures should be Skipton residents so John Launder, Charles Dobson, Phil Lawler, and Fiona Protheroe agreed.

1. Town of Sanctuary

Decided that Skipton could apply for Town of Sanctuary status. John Launder to complete forms.

1. Town of Sanctuary Leaflet

Fiona suggested Skipton produces a small leaflet cf the Leeds City of Sanctuary tear of card (information on one half and fill in joining form on tear off portion)

1. Stuff collection Rota

Jette read out a letter it is proposed to send to all churches and places that would organise a collection of 'stuff for refugees' once a month on a rota basis. Quakers already agreed to organise one month. Venue will be asked to collect stuff, load van in afternoon which will be sent to Red Cross Bradford or Yorkshire Aid AND to pay transport costs. Charles Dobson agreed that Holy Trinity will probably organise one month. Jette to act as point of contact and an up to date list of goods needed will be provided.

9. What to do next?

Craven District Council will at some point be requesting a skills list of what local people can offer when Syrian refugees arrive.

Before new initiatives are set up it would be good to find on what is already available to which Syrian refugees could join in:-

- Trinity Methodist luncheon group contact Alan Hickman (every Thursday??)
- Global Café at St Andrews contact Gill Beckett (One Tuesday every Month)

Other suggestions:-

- Weekly social event
- Welcome event
- A Welcome to Skipton leaflet for Syrian refugees about what is on, where to go etc. (translated)
- English classes
- SRSG members asked to give direct debit (£2 per month etc) as a discretionary fund to support refugees.
